

1. They originally had no law-making authority of their own, but their power grew with time. The first two were named Abu Bakar and Omar. FTP, identify this political position, which literally means "successor", that functioned as judges and temporal leaders in the medieval Islamic empire.

2. A British doctor claims Squirrel Nutkin, one of her title characters, shows the basic signs of Tourette's Syndrome. FTP name this author, whose other children's books include *The Tailor of Gloucester* and *The Tale of Peter Rabbit*.

A: (Helen) Beatrix Potter

3. He represented the owners in a 1952 Supreme Court case that overturned Truman's appropriation of US steel mills. FTP, name this man, who on the 102nd ballot became the compromise Democratic Presidential candidate in 1924 against Calvin Coolidge.

A: John W. Davis

4. Considered by many to be the Bible of the art of writing, this text has been called a required companion for all writers by the *New York Times*. FTP, name this 1959 book, written by William Strunk Jr. and E.B. White.

A: *The Elements of Style*

5. In 1832-34, 1849-54, 1866-67, and 1873, the US had major epidemics of this disease, whose rapid, gruesome symptoms scared New Yorkers so much that in the 1832 epidemic, 40% of the population fled. FTP, name this disease caused by the vibriocomma microbe, discovered by Robert Koch in 1876.

A: cholera

6. Born in Bastrop, Louisiana in 1907, he became a full-time catcher in 1929 and played in 8 World Series. He was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1954 with a .313 career average. FTP, name this prominent Yankee of the 1930s and 1940s.

7. A son of Odin and Frigg, he was noted for the light which shone from his face. He is destined to return to life after Ragnarok. FTP, name this Norse god of innocence and piety, slain by his brother Hoth by the manipulation of Loki.

A: Balder

8. The census puts the US population at 106 million, the League of Women Voters is founded, and the Senate defeats the League of Nations Covenant. All in, FTP, what year, in which Warren Harding was elected president.

A: 1920

9. She turned to writing after a bout of rheumatic fever ended her aspiration to be a pianist, and spent her last ten years in a wheelchair, finishing her last book *Sweet as a Pickle and Clean as a Pig*. FTP, name this author of *The Square Root of Wonderful*, *Clock Without Hands*, and *The Heart is a Lonely Hunter*.

A: Carson McCullers

10. John Candy will be remembered for his comic genius, but not for his last film, a 1995 bomb directed by *TV Nation* impresario Michael Moore. FTP name this film, featuring Alan Alda as the president of the U.S.

A: Canadian Bacon

11. His first published volume, *White Buildings*, contains the poem "For the Marriage of Faustus and Helen", a response to Eliot's "The Wasteland". FTP, name this poet, who attempted to create an epic out of the American experience in his 1930 work *The Bridge*.

A: (Harold) Hart Crane

12. It banned interlocking directorates, defined unfair business practices, and clarified that labor is not regarded as a commodity, but exempted cases that did not threaten free trade. FTP, name this 1914 legislation designed to restrict the growth and power of corporate monopolies.

A: Clayton Anti-Trust Act

13. This figure was recently displayed in the Smithsonian Museum of American History, now has a five-year deal with ABC for family programming, and was grand marshal for the 1996 Tournament of Roses Parade. FTP, name this star of a new version of "Treasure Island" who knows "it's not easy being green."

A: Kermit the Frog

14. Resurgence of interest in frontier life has spurred the release of some of her unpublished material and new critical studies. FTP, name this author, whose blend of fiction and autobiography set a new standard for children's literature, as in *On the Banks of Plum Creek* and *Little House in the Big Woods*.

A: Laura Ingalls Wilder or Laura Ingalls

15. This composer based his most famous work on the artistry of this best friend Victor Hartmann. FTP, name this member of the Mighty Handful, who used a show of Hartmann's work as the basis for his *Pictures at an Exhibition*?

A: Modeste Mussorgsky

16. His first book was a poetry collection called *A Lume Spento*. He moved to Europe in 1908 and supported Mussolini with pro-fascist propaganda, for which he was later indicted for treason by the US. FTP, identify this author of the *Cantos* and other Imagist poetry.

A: Ezra Pound

17. One of the agreements in the creation of the new Microsoft-NBC cable news channel was the dissolving of this NBC-owned cable channel. FTP, name this channel, whose hosts include E. Jean Carroll and Christopher Matthews.

A: America's Talking

20. After a 1948 antitrust suit, it divested its movie theaters. In 1994, its attempt to align with Viacom ended with a costly damages award. FTP, name this unlucky-in-court motion picture studio, whose UPN network is floundering.

21. Thomas was an American lawyer and political leader, George was a famous American admiral, John was an American philosopher and educator, and Melvil was a librarian. FTP, provide the common surname.

22. During her soap opera days in the 1960's, this actress claimed her dimensions to be 20-20-20. FTP, name this actress, star of *Miami Rhapsody*, ex-wife of Frank Sinatra and Andre Previn and former lover of Woody Allen.

23. This apostle of Jesus is singled out only in stories occurring after the Resurrection. Also called Didamus, or "the Twin", he's noted for demanding to place his fingers in Jesus' nail holes. FTP, name this "doubting" disciple.

24. The action of this play is meant to be fantastical, which may account for the presence of a seacoast in landlocked Bohemia. It also contains the unlikely stage direction "exit stage pursued by a bear." FTP, identify this Shakespeare play centering on the characters Leontes and Hermione.

A: *The Winter's Tale*

25. This composer was a student of Martini and went on to teach Luigi Cherubini. He held many important positions, his last being court composer for Catherine the Great and her successors. He wrote more than 75 operas, but most remain in oblivion today. FTP name this composer of *Siroe* and *Vologese*.
