Tossups:

1) Ruling in the 14th century B.C., this pharoah began his reign as Amenhotep IV, but he later changed his name to reflect the monotheistic sun-god religion he tried to impose on Egyptian society. FTP, name this husband of Nefertiti and father-in-law of Tutankhamen, whose name is derived from that of the sun-disk he worshipped, Aton.

Answer: _Akhenaton_

2) He served in the merchant marines and in the Army during the Vietnam War, receiving the Bronze Star and Purple Heart. In 1974, he made his directorial debut with Seizure, while his acting debut came seven years later in The Hand, which he also wrote. FTP, identify this former New York taxi driver, who has received Oscars for his adapted screenplay for Midnight Express and for directing Platoon and Born on the Fourth of July.

Answer: Oliver_Stone_

3) Most of this country's cities, including Mopti, Segou, Djenne, and Gao, lie along the Bani and Niger rivers. A landlocked nation, it is bordered by Senegal, Guinea, the Ivory Coast, Burkina Faso, Niger, Algeria, and Mauritania. FTP, name this country, whose better known cities include Timbuktu and the capital, Bamako.

4) Last year, in a loss to Oklahoma, he became the first sophomore in major college history to rush for 1000 yards in five games. In another loss to Missouri, he became only the fifth college player in history to rush for 2000 yards in a season, and the first to do so without winning the Heisman trophy in the same season. FTP, name this Iowa state tailback.

5) An orphan, she was adopted by her uncle, who had once saved the Persian king from assassins. Married to King Ahasuerus, she revealed her Jewish identity to protect Mordecai and the other Jews of the kingdom from the intrigues of Haman. FTP, name this Old Testament heroine, whose story is told in the only book of the Bible which does not mention God, and which is named for her.

6) He was the first black man admitted to the Florida state bar after the Civil War, and he later served as US consul in Nicaragua and Venezuela. His poetry is collected in Saint Peter Relates an Incident at the Resurrection Day, Fifty Years, and God's Trombones. FTP, identify this author of Autobiography of an Ex-Colored Man, best remembered for his spiritual "Lift Every Voice and Sing."

7) Within its confines, carbohydrate groups are modified, and secretory proteins are glycosylated and cut by proteases. First described by an Italian cytologist in 1898, it has a polarized structure composed of five to eight flattened, disk-shaped cisternae, or vesicles, arranged in a stack. FTP, name this apparatus, the principal director of protein traffic in the cell.

8) Its divisions include the Economic Regulatory Administration and the Office of Civilian Radioactive Waste Management. Designed to coordinate national fuel and electricity policies, this cabinet department also conducts research into the conservation of these resources. FTP, name this department, whose first secretary, James Schlesinger, took office in 1977, and which is now headed by Hazel O'Leary.

9) His early works include the Brussels Crucifixion, the Cure for Madness and Christ Mocked. Born around 1450, it has been claimed that his pictures were done for a heretical, orgiastic cult; however, most were owned by devout Catholics like Philip II. Although he didn't publish his first novel until the age of forty, Tales of the South Pacific won him the Pulitzer Prize. FTP, identify this author, best known for long sagas like Poland, Space, and The Source.

11) Robert Ley committed suicide, Martin Bormann disappeared, and Gustav Krupp was found to be too old. Although Hjalmar Scahcht, Hans Fritsche, and Franz von Papen were acquitted, October 16, 1946 saw 10 men hanged, including Arthur Seyss-Inquart, Julius Streicher, and Alfred Jodl. FTP, identify this tribunal, at which Robert Jackson was prosecutor, during which 24 chief Nazis were tried for war crimes.

12) This man discovered the 5th star in the constellation Orion and first suggested that Jupiter rotates on its axis. His discovery that the stretching of a solid body is proportional to the force applied to it formed the basis of later studies of physical stress. FTP, name this English scientist, whose 1665 work Micrographia introduced the term "cell" to describe microscopic cavities in cork.

13) With more than 40 million albums sold, he is the best-selling instrumentalist ever. Despite being routinely panned by critics, his albums including "Breathless" and "Miracles: the Holiday Album" have won Grammys and set sales records. Named jazz artist of the decade by Billboard magazine, he has just released a new album, "The Moment". FTP, name this pop saxophonist.

After the wanderings of the first half, Book Seven features the rivalry over Lavinia between Turnus and the protagonist, a refugee from Troy. Proposed by Pauli to explain anomalies in beta decay, these neutral and almost if not completely massless particles can pass through matter with little resistance. FTP, identify these particles which have been suggested as a possible constituent of dark matter and whose name means "little neutral ones."

18) After graduating from Trinity College, he worked as editor of The Penny Press and as drama critic for the Dublin Mail. After coming to London as Sir Henry Irving's personal manager, he published The Duties of Clerks of Petty Session in Ireland. FTP, identify this author, who went on to publish 15 works of fiction, the most famous of which is the tale of John Seward, Mina Murray, Jonathan Harker, and Count Dracula.

19) Although now a marshy plain, the area once consisted of a mountain pass between Mount Oeta and the Maliac Gulf. Its name derives from the Greek for "Hot Gates" and refers to the hot springs found in the area. Its fame results from the heroic defense of that pass by Greek troops under Leonidas in 480 BC. FTP, name the area and you'll name the famed pass.

20) His books include The Nature of Mass Poverty, The New Industrial State, and Economics and the Public Purpose. He served as ambassador to India under John F. Kennedy, and much of his work deals with the poverty in the Third World. FTP, name this Canadian-born economist, best known for his 1958 classic, The Affluent Society.
