TOSSUPS

1. Founded on July 25, 1536, it did not develop economically until the 1950s due largely to its landlocked position. Thanks to the Cauca Valley Corporation, an autonomous body modeled on the TVA, it is now Colombia's third largest city. For ten points, in what Colombian city is home to a new powerful drug cartel?

CALI

2. For a short time in 1906, he became a general handyman in Upton Sinclair's utopian colony in Englewood, New Jersey, Helicon Hall. In 1910 he settled into a small editorial post at Frederick A. Stokes Publishing Company in New York. FTP, name this author affectionately known as "Red" whose first novel, "Our Mr. Wrenn" was published in 1913.

SINCLAIR LEWIS

3. The center of an administrative region of the same name, occupying the Kola peninsula, between the White and Barents Seas, this city received most of the goods shipped by the United States and Great Britain to the Soviet Union during World War II. FTP, identify this Russian port city.

MURMANSK

4. Bunions are a class of these pouches classified as adventitious, subcutaneous, or synovial. For ten points, what name is given to the sacs of lubricating fluid located in the joints to reduce friction between points of friction or stress?

BURSAE

5. Although the practice reached its peak in the 1850s, 20th Century politician Strom Thurmond holds the record for the longest solo one of these. This tactic, frequently employed by the minority party in the Senate, generally involves giving long speeches and passing floor time to other members of the same party. For ten points, identify this procedure.

FILIBUSTER(ing)

6. A partner in a lead mine and oil prospecting business, both of which failed, his career turned around when he won a seat as a county judge with the help of a political boss and the support of other World War I veterans. For ten points, identify this politician recently portrayed in an award winning performance by Gary Sinese.

HARRY S. TRUMAN

7. Appointed to the Bundestag by a majority of one vote, he rose to prominence in the German Christian Democratic Union during World War II. A staunch anti-socialist, FTP, name the first chancellor of West Germany.

CONRAD ADENAUER

8. Eschewing party politics he functioned as a political independent and resigned from the Senate rather than reverse his vote censuring Andrew Jackson for his removing deposits from the Bank of the United States. As president, he became known as "His Accidency". For ten points, identify this Whig who became the first man to succeed to the presidency on the death of a sitting president.

JOHN TYLER

9. This astronomy term is given to the average time between successive returns of a planet to the same apparent position relative to the sun and earth, such as the time between two successive opposition. For ten points, identify it?

SYNODIC PERIOD

10. In the Islamic religion, this term is given to the leader who will appear at the end of the world to save true believers What is this term which, though never mentioned in the Koran, has been claimed by several people?

MAHDI

11. This race of creatures was created from the blood of Uranus. Unfortunately they were ultimately destroyed by Zeus. For ten points name them.

THE GIANTS

12. During his vacations in 1908 to 1910 he studied medieval castles in France and Syria and wrote his first book, "Crusaders Castles." In January 1914 he joined Lord Kitchener's "Sinai Survey", a military intelligence project disguised as surveying and contributed an official report on the project. For ten points, who was this author of the autobiographical The Seven Pillars of Wisdom?

T.E. LAWRENCE

13. As a youth, he had become intrigued with the idea of building a submersible craft. In 1881 he launched the Fenian Ram, a 31 foot long submarine that embodied the chief principles of the modern submarine in balance and control. FTP, identify this

inventor who launched the first sub equipped with a gasoline engine and electric batteries in 1898.

JOHN P. HOLLAND

14. This Canadian province is home to the city of Churchill, a town famous for the polar bears which like to visit in the summer. More than half of the province lies within the Canadian Shield, a rugged, rocky, glacier-scoured plateau that crosses the province from northwest to southeast. FTP, identify this provinces which contains Lake Winnipeg.

MANITOBA

15. The Navy and the Army do not seem to want to get it together, at least in ranking officers. A naval ensign is equivalent to an Army second lieutenant. A naval lieutenant is the equivalent to an Army captain. FTP, what is the army rank which is equivalent to a naval captain?

COLONEL

16. This Dartmouth graduate and American statesman served as William Henry Harrison's Secretary of State For ten points, who is this orator, famous for many great speeches and quotes such as "Liberty and Union, now and forever, one and inseparable!"

DANIEL WEBSTER

17. According to Shakespeare, she dreamt of her husband's assassination the night before it occurred. For ten points, identify the prophetic woman, wife of Julius Caesar.

CALPURNIA

18. Reggae classics such as, "I shot the Sheriff," "No woman, no cry," and "Buffalo Soldier" cemented this lead singer's legend and appeared on his best of album, entitled "Legend". For 10 points, identify this lead singer and or his group.

BOB MARLEY AND THE WAILERS

19. He received his most extensive training from Peter Behrens, a pioneer in modern functional architecture who also trained Le Corbusier. By 1914 he had achieved a continental reputation for his designs of the Fagus Factory at Alfeld and the Hall of Machinery at the Werkbund Exposition in Cologne. FTP, name this man whose Bauhaus school was closed by the Nazis.

WALTER GROPIUS

20. Above ground, the park contains a wooded, rolling landscape, traversed by 2 forest bordered rivers. Below, it contains a cave

with 150 miles of explored corridors, long considered one of the seven wonders of the New World. FTP, identify the only national park located in the state of Kentucky.

MAMMOTH CAVE NATIONAL PARK

21. Translated as "The Twilight of the Gods," it is the last opera in Wagner's Ring cycle, in which Asgard is destroyed as are the Gods. For ten points, identify it.

DIE GOTTERDAMMERUNG

22. Creator of Sally Bowles in his 1946 novel *Berlin Stories*, this 20th century English novelist was one of a group of left-wing intellectual writers who rose to fame in the 1930's. For ten points, name him.

CHRISTOPHER ISHERWOOD

23. Two answers required. In 1938, these two leaders signed a document stating that "we are determined to remove possible sources of difference and thus contribute to assure the peace of Europe." For ten points, who were these two signers of the Munich Pact?

HITLER AND CHAMBERLAIN

24. This term given to an object that can both emit and absorb all possible wavelengths of electromagnetic radiation. For ten points, identify this dark physics term.

BLACK BODY

25. To prove that a famous name was all he lacked, he published "Leonanie" in the style of Edgar Allen Poe in the Kokomo, Indiana Dispatch, thus pulling off the famous Poe Hoax of 1877. FTP, identify the American poet known as the "Hoosier Poet" because of his use of Indiana Hoosier dialect.

JAMES WHITCOMB RILEY

26. She was chosen for Henry VIII by his chief advisor in the hope that an alliance with the German Protestants would counterbalance the growing unity between the Catholic powers of France and the Holy Roman Emperor. Fourth of his six wives, she succeeded Jane Seymour who had died during childbirth. FTP, identify this lady whose marriage with Henry was annulled after 5 months.

27. When he retired, he had won ten championships, more than any other college basketball coach in history. FTP, identify the Wizard of Westwood.

JOHN WOODEN

28. This plan centered around dividing the South and cutting off its trade with other nations. For ten points, identify this successful Union plan to defeat the South in the Civil War which carries a reptilian name.
